#### **Introduction to Bird Ringing Workshop**

The proposed activity is a two-day workshop at Laem Phak Bia Environmental Research and Development Project between 11-12 June 2016 about bird ringing and how it contributes to migratory bird conservation. The target groups include BCST members who are mostly bird watchers and bird enthusiasts, as well as the staff at Laem Phak Bia Environmental Research and Development Project and students from the local “Birdwatching Club” at Phetchaburi Rajabhat University.

Activity on the first day will cover lectures given by ornithologists who are experienced bird ringers and representatives from the Bung Boraphet Wildlife Research Station, a division under the Department of National Parks that carry out bird ringing session on regular basis. Main topics will include rationale and benefits of bird ringing, how bird ringing contributes to bird migration studies and bird conservation, various methods of bird ringing and overview of bird ringing in Thailand.

A bird ringing session will be arranged on the second day. Laem Phak Bia Environmental Research and Development Station, located in the Pak Thale – Laem Phak Bia core area, is well known as one of the sites where bird ringing has been extensively carried out in order to study migratory birds. It is also a major wintering site for many migratory species of the East Asian-Australasian flyway, many of which including Spoon-billed Sandpiper (*Calidris pygmaea*) and Nordmann’s Greenshank (*Tringa guttifer*) are classified as globally endangered. The area is also declared as one of the EAA Flyway Network Sites. Here, participants will engage in the learning process of bird ringing with the lead of experienced bird ringers who continuously work at the project.

Because bird ringing is still a rather foreign concept in Thailand despite the active status of bird ringing in the country, we aim to provide knowledge and understanding about the activity to bird watchers and bird enthusiasts. We also aim to raise awareness regarding the importance of bird migration studies, particularly in the East Asian-Australasian flyway where many human-related threats have been identified, as well as the importance of Pak Thale – Laem Phak Bia area as a major flyway network site in Thailand. As a pilot workshop, we aim to involve approximately 50 participants. Outputs of the workshop will include a report for EAAFP including photos from the workshop, as well as a summary report and photos to be published in BCST website and Facebook page.
