Title of the event: The paradise of migratory bird species through the lenses of the artists and photographers

Purpose: We plan to organize a field trip for the artists and photographers on the occasion of the Migratory Birds' day with twofold purpose. First, we aim to engage artists and photographers in raising awareness of public on the importance of conservation of migratory bird species of the Khar-Us Lake National Park, one of the 11 Ramsar sites in Mongolia. Second, we aim to initiate a database of photographs and artworks that would potentially lead to produce an album on the birds of the Khar-Us Lake National Park.

Outcome: This first ever event of its kind shall result in organizing an exhibition for Khovd province residents and school children displaying photographs and artworks. It is estimated that the exhibition will reach at least 10000 people during 10 days of exhibition. Moreover, the itinerary shall be featured as "the special Bird watching tour" of the Khar-Us Lake National Park and be organized on annual basis.

Where: Khar-Us Lake, Khovd province, Western Mongolia

Duration: 7-8th May 2016

Itinerary of total of 400km: Khovd city - Shuvuun waterfall - Khers island - Khar-Us Lake - Buyant Myangad - Ulaan tolgoi – Yumiin valley – Dalai Lake – Khar Lake sand cape.

Organizer: Altai Nomads NGO

Support organizations: Khar-Us Lake National Park Administration, Photographers' group named "Different Angle", Khovd TV

Participants: Photographers' group, Mongolian Grayling sport fishing group, Association of young artists of Khovd province, freelance artists, Technology teachers of the general secondary school of Khovd province.

Information by the biologists: We have invited the biologists of WWF-Mongolia's field office in Khovd to take part of this field trip and give information about the migratory bird species, talk about the specificities of the birds, instruct on how to identify them, fill-in the monitoring book and so on. A special focus shall be given to the bird species subject to illegal killing and trade, for example the endangered Dalmatian Pelican, subject to the illegal trade due to its beak used in traditional lifestyle-related item.

Support from the government organization: the Khar-Us Lake National Park administration is very appreciative to such initiative and willing to lead the organization of this field trip from the next year. The administration is planning to feature this trip as "the special Bird watching tour" of the Park.

Moreover, we have consulted with Mr. Batbold Dorjgurkhem, the National focal point of EAAFP and got full support from his side to apply for this grant.

Actions: The major activities during the field trip include bird watching, photograph sessions, artworks drawing by the artists, information sessions and lectures by the biologists. After-trip events include exhibition of 10-day duration, TV program and news on the local TV channel, awards ceremony of best artwork and photograph.

Budget: the overall budget we need is 2700000MNT or about 1350USD. The organizer is working hard now to raise this amount and shall be very appreciative if a small grant of 1000USD that you have announced would be granted to our event, the first of its kind in this particular Ramsar site. If we are granted 1000USD, we will cover the funding gap of 350USD from our own budget.

The participants shall range between 20-30 people and are expected to cover their own transport and food during the field trip. The budget covers the transport, fuel and per diem of organizers and guest biologists (2) only.
