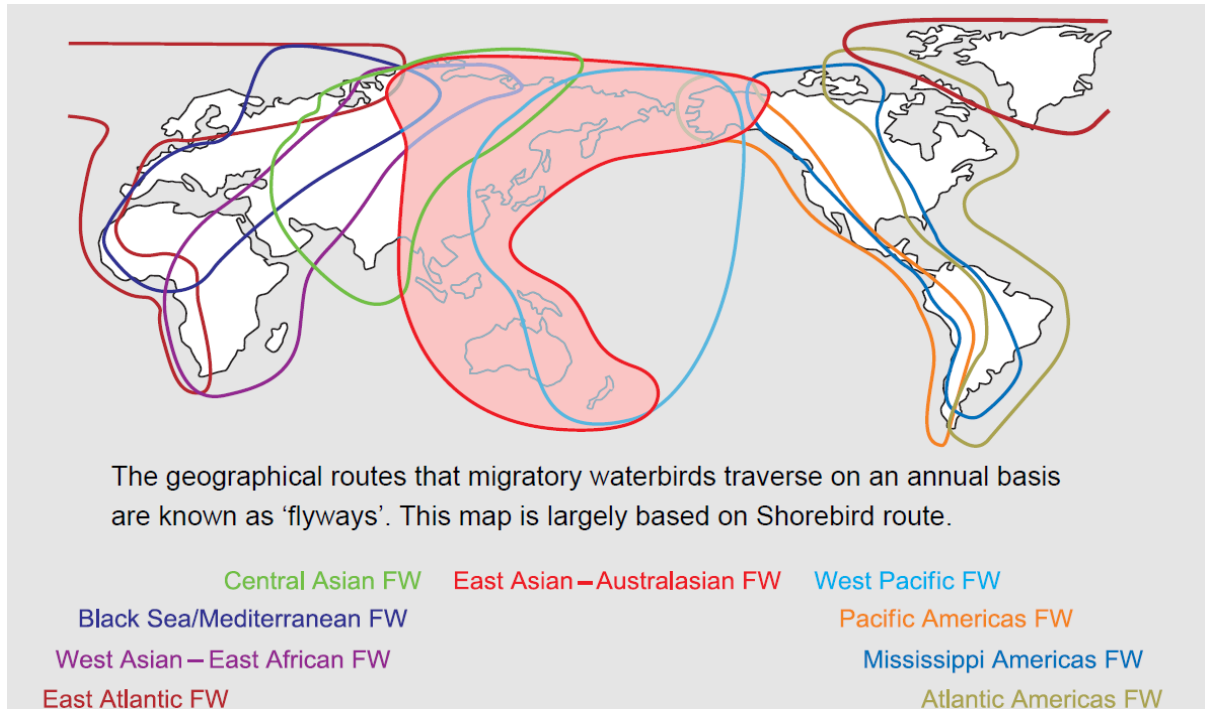

3. SHORT SUMMARY REPORT

We celebrated the World Migratory Bird Day 2016 in Wasur National Park, Papua, Indonesia, 15 & 21-22 May 2016. The celebration was held by Wasur National Park, coordinated by Ramli (Forest Ecosystem Controller) and Amin Suprajitno (Head of Regional Section II), with a support from East Asian Australasian Flyway Partnership Secretariat.

In order to provide relevant information and to promote the protection of migratory waterbirds to wider public, this celebration held by invited local students to do the waterbirds observation in the national park areas of Ndalir and Payum coasts. At the same time simple training on bird identification, observation and survey techniques were also provided.

In addition, visit paid to the farmer settlement in the transmigration areas to provide information and discussion on migratory waterbirds protection as well as observation in the agricultural areas.

The activities has been successfully added awareness to local students and farmers on the importance of protecting migratory waterbirds, especially which were using agriculture areas in the transmigration settlement and coastal areas in the national park.
