

Training course for Indonesian and Philippine

seabird researchers

 Initiated by the Chinese Crested Tern Project in eastern Indonesia, and the national seabird fora of Indonesia and the Philippines.

- Purpose: to empower seabird researchers on technique of survey and conservation
- Organized by the Hong Kong Bird Watching Society with financial support from Japan Fund for Global Environment
- 18 (in Bahasa Indonesia) and 19 (in English) March 2022.
 Online.
- Covering topics on identification, survey methods, census and monitoring, banding and tracking, site management, outreaching and engaging local communities, and international networking.
- A total of more than 170 participants, mainly from Indonesia and the Philippines but also Malaysia, Brunei, Viet Nam and Myanmar.









- Compilation period: late 2021 to summer of 2022
- Geographic scope: EAAF countries except USA, Russia, PNG, Australia and New Zealand
- Data from published papers and reports (including national languages), and consultation with more than 50 experts
- Some examples of uses of the registry:
 - Sensitivity map for development
 - Potential protected areas
 - Monitoring of population trends
 - Surveillance of avian diseases
- Will be uploaded to Global Seabird Portal
- Expect more sites will be identified, particularly in SE Asia
- Presented at Pacific Seabird Group Meeting in San Diego, USA in mid-February 2023 with very positive feedbacks


