Monitoring the Migratory Shorebirds in West Gulf of Mottama Ramsar Site

Project Proposal:

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1.	Objectives:	Strengthing the Coastal Communities for Monitoring of Migratory Shorebirds in the Gulf of Mottama Ramsar Site
2. Background:		The Spoon-billed Sandpiper <i>Calidris pygmaea</i> is a long-distance migratory shorebird which is lised as Critically Endangered in the IUCN RedList of Threatened species. It is a highly charismatic species that has declined by nearly 90% since the early 2000s and is now down to about 490 mature individuals (95% CL = 360–620). Biodiversity And Nature Conservation Association (BANCA) has been explored the sites for Spoon-
		billed Sandpiper as the important wintering ground since 2008. Approximately half of the global population is understood to be wintering in Myanmar and the large majority in the Gulf of Mottama (GoM). The Gulf is one of the most importance and unique intertidal mudflat wetland systems in the world. The highly productivity of the wetland system supports up to 200,000 waterbirds, of which 12 are Globally Threatened according to the IUCN RedList of Threatened Species including including Spoon-billed Sandpiper.
	BANCA formed Local Conservation Groups (LCGs) to be effective the conservation works in Mor State in 2013 and built their capacity by providing trainings, eduation and awareness rasiaing program. Moreover, BANCA exploered the hunters who were relying on bird hunting activities, then changed their livelihood as alternative ways in 2011.	
	BANCA conducted a lot of consultations with relavant government agencies and local commutities to be designed the Gulf of Mottama as Ramsar Site. In 2017, the northern part of the Gulf area (42,500 ha) was designated as Fourth Ramsar Site (Site No. 2299) in Myanmar including Bilin and Kyaik Hto Twonships in Mon State. In 2020, the Gulf was extended to cover a total of 161,030 hectares including the areas of Thaton and Poung Townships in Mon State and Kawa and Thanatpin in Bago Region.	
		Moreover, the Gulf of Mottama is recognized as the first Flyway Network Site (EAAF117) in Myanmai and Important Bird Area (MM056) as well.
		In 2022, BANCA formed the very first LCGs in six villages where are neartsest and mainly depending on the Gulf. Then, subsequently, BANCA promoted their knowledge and capacity on conservation to be site guards. But, to be utlaized the lessons in practically, follow up training program with more relevants topics will be needed for them.
		Thus, the project will be fulfilled the gap for the strengthening of LCG members in sustainable conservation in the Gulf of Mottama in Myanmar.

		The project will conduct by three acitivities are as follow;
		Activity (1) Training on Shorebird Conservation and Methodlogy of Illegal Bird Huinting and Taking of Birds Survey - October 2023 This training will be provided to LCGs to improve their capacity in community outreach and shorebirds monitoring in the Gulf of Mottama. Basic bird watching to identify and conserve the shorebirds, basic

	 Spatial Monitoring And Reporting Tool (SMART) patrolling mailly focus on data entry level, and survey techniques of illegal bird hunting and taking of birds in markets will involve in the training's topics. Method: Powerpowint presentations, awarenss videos and quiz games will be involved in the training. Moreover, pamphelts and handouts related to the training's topics will be shared to the trainees. Activity (2) Shorebirds Monritoring Survey and Patrolling – October 2023 to January 2024 This activity will be provided to improve the protection of species and their habitats from threats. Method: Monthly shorebird monitoring survey and patrolling activity will be conducted by community-based approach to record migratory birds in wintering season and also strengthen enforcement in the Gulf. Activity (3) To assess and identify the illgal birds hunting in villages and local markets - October 2023 to January 2024 This activity will be conducted by LCGs in and around their villages during migratory seasons to . Method: Interview survey: This activity will carry out by using questionnaire to the villagers who know illegal bird hunting markets and information, bird sellers and hunters (if possible). Market survey: This activity will carry out in local markets based on interview survey results.

Explain the part of your project for which you are seeking EAAFP funds in this Application (provide details in the Project Budget section below):	(National Focal Point) in early 2021, the LCGs are poorly coordinated and LCGs members are voiceless in Village Development Committee which were established under the Gulf of Mottama project funded by Swiss Agency for Development and Cooperation (SDC). On the other hand, villagers are struggling economically in times of Covid-19 and political turmoil in Myanmar and there are reports of birds were being caught and sold at the local market. Illegal fishing and unsustainable hunting is an immediate and severe threat to wild bird populations in Myanmar. Futhermore, in the western part of the Gulf of Mottama, there is a lack of community-based conservation for the Spoon-billed Sandpiper and other migratory shore bird species. Therefore, we are seeking fund through this application.

BANCA has been carrying out the conservation of Critically endangered Spoon-billed Sandpiper (*Calidris pygmaea*) and other migratory wetland birds since 2008 in Myanmar. The sustainable activities such as changing the vocational work for the bird hunters, providing trainings for bird watching, capacity building, regional development activities were provided to local communities.

In 2010-2011, socio economic and exploring bird hunter survey was conducted and provided alternative livelihood who were maily relying on bird hunting for income source in east and west Gulf of Mottama. Then, education and awareness programs to bird hunters and also local communities. In 2013, BANCA formed Local Conservation Groups (LCGs) to support the sustabinal conservation of Spoon-billed Sandpiper and its habitats in the Gulf of Mottama. A lot of consultation with local and national to be designated the Gulf as Ramsar Site in Myanmar. Moreover, BANCA has advocated to regional governments and local communities on the importance of wetlands in biodiversity and community livelihood and also about stopping the illegal bird killing in wetlands in Mandalay region in central Myanmar. Mandalay government has checked the current situation of illegal bird killing at Paleik Lake in 2018 and undertook patrols during the wintering period. In addition, the Mandalay government formed Mandalay Wetlands Conservation Committee, chaired by Minister, Ministry of Nature Resources and Environmental Conservation and BANCA is one of the members of this committee. In order to highlight waterbird killing in the Mandalay area, BANCA has done surveys of Illegal Bird Killing in local markets, restaurants, pet shops and pagodas. After that, the finding of our results was explained in the meeting of "Reporting a result of Illegal Bird Killing survey". In this meeting, the minister, Ministry of Nature Resources and Environmental Conservation and wetland conservation committee participated and discussed the future activities to prevent increases in bird killing and markets in Mandalay. BANCA also has significant wider experience in the implementation of waterbird conservation activities for Spoon-billed Sandpiper in the Gulf of Mottama and Nan Thar Island, Myanmar.

Ms. Ei Thinzar Aung, Program Officer will be charged in the project. She is working for wetland conservation for Spoon-billed Sandpiper in Myanmar especially for CEPA program since 2018 and closely collaboration with Forest Department for designation of Ramsar Sites in Myanmar. She has good communication and relationship with local communities of the project sites. She also involved in climate change vulnerabitly assessment in wetand in Mandalay Region and regional situation anaylysis on the hunting and take of migratory birds in Myanmar.
