1.6 Outcome - What is the outcome from your event?

The Nature Conservation Society-Myanmar (NCS) has organized the World Migratory Bird Day (WMBD) event on May 18, 2023, with the theme "Water Sustaining Bird Life." Around 77 participants, including people of all ages and genders, attended the event to raise awareness about the important of wetland and water and also the conservation of migratory birds. During the workshop, all participants gain insights and knowledge about the challenges and opportunities on the conservation of migratory waterbirds in their region, the Gulf of Mottma.

During the workshop, one response from the participants is that although there are not many birds hunting activities in their area, some people set up hunting nets at night and take them down early in the morning, making it challenging to misunderstand of no bird hunting. Furthermore, other also mentioned that some people place poison bait (mixed with potassium cyanide and small shrimp and fish) as food for shorebirds along the shoreline and mudflat at following tide, causing bird deaths when the tide recedes and caused mortality, decreased population. All participants agreed that more education awareness is necessary to cover the whole community area in GoM to effectively combat bird poaching in long-term. The participants reflected on how to protect migratory birds' habitats in their area, especially wetlands, by exploring ideas to reduce potential threats that undermine the ecosystems.

During the workshop and group discussions, women actively contributed their perspectives, indicating that environmental conservation transcends gender and requires the active collaboration of everyone. Moreover, this workshop was featured by different discussion topics among different generations to understand their thoughts, indigenous knowledge on migratory birds. Their input demonstrated that greater involvement with women's groups could yield better conservation outcomes in the future.

The event's success highlights the need for continued efforts to reduce threats to migratory birds and to preserve their habitats. Additional measures could include raising



awareness through targeted campaigns and proposed of policies to protect important bird habitats in their area. Therefore, more comprehensive conservation strategies with integrated approaches are necessary to protect migratory birds' remaining populations from further reductions in the ecosystem.

The opening ceremony began with a speech by the community leader welcoming the WMBD 2023. The NCS-Myanmar team then gave a presentation about the formation of WMBD and the themes for each year, as well as sharing the "Migratory Bird" song in



Burmese that was created for WMBD 2020, and other videos. After that, the importance of water for both people and wildlife was presented.

After a tea break, the workshop on the conservation of migratory birds in GoM was started. the NCS-Myanmar continued their presentations with information about animal migration, the importance of wetlands and water for migratory birds, and their migration patterns. In the afternoon after the lunch, participants were then divided into five groups for a brainstorming session about the correlation between their livelihoods and migratory birds. Each group then presented their findings and thoughts separately, and the NCS-Myanmar team shared interpretation results with the audience. In addition, the participants are provided with enjoyable lunches, as well as afternoon tea and snacks, for which they are thankful.

- (3) Traditional Knowledge About Migratory Birds,

Nature Conservation Society-Myanmar (NCS) organized the first World Migratory Bird Day (WMBD) event for 2023 on May 18th, with financial support by East Asian-Australasian Flyway Partnership (EAAFP). The event, originally scheduled for May 13th, 2023, had to be rescheduled due to the impact of Cyclone Mocha, which struck the west coast of Myanmar on May 13th and 14th, 2023. Our first WMBD event took place in a Basic Education Primary School located in Koe Tae Su Village in Belin Township, near the Gulf of Mottama (GoM) in Myanmar, and had a total of 77 participants, mostly consisting of school students, villagers, and local communities from villages surrounding the GoM. Participants were given T-shirts with WMBD themes printed on the front and slogans on the back. The members of Local Conservation Groups (LCGs) from Koe Te Su, Mu Thin, Kan Ywar, and Aung Kan Thar villages from Bilin, Thaton Townships joined the event.

The event began with the opening ceremony which was celebrated with an opening speech delivered by the Head of the Local Community, a presentation about the formation of WMBD, its annual celebrations, and the importance of water "Theme of this year. After the opening ceremony, the workshop was held continuously from 9:30 AM to 03:00 PM local time in the same venue as the opening ceremony. The presentations on animal migration, flyway patterns of migratory birds, and the population status of migratory birds and threats to them in the GoM. There was also presentation on environmental conservation and habitats of migratory birds at the GoM, which was related to the 2023 WMBD theme of "Water Sustaining Bird Life" and socio-ecological justice for the environment as well.

The NCS organized two ways presentations for participants, where they discuss migratory bird habitats and create awareness about them. The audience is often amazed by the long journey of birds undertake over vast distances, migration records, different migration patterns of different migratory species. During the workshop, they learned about the importance of wetlands and water in relation to migratory birds and how it affects their livelihoods.

To develop the measures to mitigate negative impacts on wetlands and migratory birds, the participants are divided into five groups to brainstorm ideas and discuss the correlation between their livelihoods and migratory birds. Each focusing on different topics such as bird hunting, attitudes towards migratory birds, traditional knowledge about migratory birds, roles of local organizations, and livelihoods and poverty reduction. The topics were developed with the agreements of the participants and purposed to develop and gain diverse ideas and thoughts of different genders and generations. After their group discussions, each group presented and shared their findings and thoughts on their respective topics separately.

One impressive thing discovered was that women were also actively involved in participating and contributing to their visions. The attendees were already familiar with the migration of birds in their area due to previous seminars, workshops, and events sponsored by EAAFP. However, this time, the audience was made aware of the benefits



of establishing conservation zones for birds, and they expressed a desire for more conservation zones in their area to reduce habitat loss and the threat to migratory birds. During the event, attendees enjoyed the songs, presentations, and videos about migratory birds and had fun during the group discussions and reports also foods as well. The NCS-Myanmar organized the event, which lasted from 8:00 AM to 3:30 PM on May 18, 2023.

Overall, the event was a success in raising awareness about the importance of migratory birds and their habitats, and involving locals in conservation efforts. It is hoped that such events will continue to be organized, promoting the importance of environmental conservation and habitat preservation for migratory birds in their flyways.
