About World Migratory Bird Day 2023

WMBD is an annual awareness-raising campaign highlighting the need for the conservation of migratory birds and their habitats. It has a global outreach and is an effective tool to help raise global awareness of the threats faced by migratory birds, their ecological importance, and the need for international cooperation to conserve them. In 2018, WMBD unified the planet's major migratory bird corridors, or flyways: the African-Eurasian flyway, the East Asian-Australasian flyway, and the Americas flyways. WMBD is now celebrated twice a year, on the Second Saturday in May and in October. In 2023, WMBD will be held on 13 May and 14 October. This year, the theme is "Water: Sustaining Bird Life". The EAAFP Secretariat encourages Partners to celebrate WMBD twice a year.

Introduction of EAAFP WMBD 2023 Small Grant

The Small Grant for 2023 <u>World Migratory Bird Day</u> (WMBD) has been established to provide financial support to <u>EAAFP Partners</u> and <u>EAAFP Task Forces and Working Groups</u> who plan to organize <u>public events and/or conservation action-oriented workshops</u> at national or local levels through participating in the World Migratory Bird Day. We strongly encourage EAAFP Partners and collaborators to make an application for any suitable event or development of WMBD materials in local language that aims to raise awareness on the need of conserving migratory waterbirds and the value of their habitats in East Asian – Australasian Flyway.

Eligibility Criteria

Applicants who plan to organize an event to celebrate World Migratory Bird Day 2023 need to **base in the EAAFP Partner countries.** In addition, EAAFP Partner countries included in the DAC list of ODA Recipients are our priority to support (If you are not sure, please see the <u>list of EAAFP Partners</u>, and <u>DAC list of ODA Recipients</u>). If you are not the country focal point of EAAFP, please consult and plan with EAAFP focal point of your country before you apply.

Please note that this grant is to initiate a WMBD event, you can co-fund the event with other sources, but please indicate in the budget session. Applications with similar contents (location, target participants etc.) to previous years may not be accepted. We also encourage proposals to promote Flyway Network Sites for the WMBD activities.

Information of the application

Firstly, Applicants must meet the eligibility criteria set for funding assistance under EAAFP WMBD 2023 Small Grants Programme.

For your budget planning, please note a <u>maximum of 1,000 USD will be allocated to each country.</u> We recommend you submit the application form as early as possible.

The deadline for application is <u>31st August, 2023</u>. Please submit an application form to Communication Officer via email (Word or PDF document) at <u>communication@eaaflyway.net</u> and <u>wmbd@eaaflyway.net</u>.

After the Secretariat receives your application, the approval of successful proposals is made by the Secretariat. Applicants will hear of the result within two weeks after the deadline. Incomplete applications will not be accepted.

Successful applicants have a responsibility to help translate the World Migratory Bird Day materials into their own languages which will be shared on the World Migratory Bird Day website (https://www.worldmigratorybirdday.org/).

Title of event:	Increasing Public Awareness of Migratory Shorebird Conservation through a Photography and Coloring Contest on the East Coast of Batubara Regency, North Sumatra.
Date of event:	11 - 12 October 2023
Organizers:	WHIS Indonesia Foundation
Target participants:	Local communities and elementary students.
Expected number of participants:	We expected; - Up to 100 local communities join the photography contest Up to 200 students will join the art-drawing activities.

Event objectives and plan (max. 500 words):

The Eastern Coast of North Sumatra stands as a significant region for migratory shorebirds within Indonesia. Over the period of 2018-2021, consistent monitoring efforts have revealed an annual presence of no less than 50,000 individual birds along this stretch. Notably, this area has also documented the presence of endangered migratory shorebirds species, including the Nordmann Greenshank, Great Knot, and Far-eastern Curlew and endangered resident waterbirds like the Milky Stork and Lesser Adjutant (Putra *et al.* 2021; WHIS database). Recognizing its ecological importance, Birdlife International (2001) designated it as a Key Biodiversity Area (KBAs). But, this information is not widely known by local people around the coast as well as people who live in the cities. So it is necessary to hold awareness campaigns on a regular basis.

Annual occasions such as WMBD provide an ideal opportunity for us to engage and collaborate collectively. This event, synchronized across numerous countries, represents a commitment to safeguard and protect migratory avian species on our planet, including those inhabiting the shores/mudflats of Batubara Regency.


The aims of the activities are;

- 1. Enhancing the awareness and knowledge of migratory shorebirds among both local communities and students in Batubara Regency regarding the significance of their locale in conserving migratory shorebirds.
- 2. Unveiling the inherent ecological richness of North Sumatra, particularly the Batubara Coastline, as a prime destination for ecotourism pursuits like birdwatching and wildlife photography.
- 3. Providing a platform for the exchange of insights among nature and photography enthusiasts, students, journalists, and the broader public.
- 4. Active involvement in World Migratory Bird Day 2023.

The activity will be held for two days, on 11 - 12 October 2023, as follows;

- 1. Photography competition focusing on migratory shorebirds, resident waterbirds, and wetland ecosystems. Additionally, a bird-watching activity will be organized for both the general public and photographers, and it will take place at Sujono/Sejarah Beach.
- 2. Migratory shorebird coloring competition for elementary students in the

- Multipurpose Hall of PT. INALUM Tanjung Gading.
- 3. Photo exhibition of migratory shorebirds and wetland ecosystems in the Multipurpose Hall of PT. INALUM for the general public.
- 4. Short film screening "Migratory Shorebirds on the Eastern Coast of Batubara" and storyteller in the Multipurpose Hall of PT. INALUM Tanjung Gading.



The target participants for this activity comprise approximately 300 individuals, categorized as follows:

- 1. About 100 potential participants will engage in the photography competition, where they will submit their photos centered around the theme "Wetland and its Biodiversity." Following this, a meticulous selection process will identify 8 finalists who will be invited to join a captivating "one-day photo hunting" event at Sujono Beach. This particular event will focus on the theme "Migratory Shorebirds, Waterbirds, and Wetland Ecosystems," and it will draw participation from a diverse group including the general public, photographers, journalists, from the Medan region.
- Moreover, around 200 elementary students will actively partake in a series of engaging activities. These activities encompass a migratory shorebird coloring competition, short film screenings, and storytelling sessions.
