Section 3. SHORT SUMMARY REPORT (Compulsory)

Jagannath University orchestrated the World Migratory Bird Day 2023 event at Lombordia Government Primary School, Noakhali in Bangladesh on October 14, 2023, generously funded by the East Asian-Australasian Flyway Partnership (EAAFP). The event drew in a diverse crowd of 202 participants, encompassing school students from various classes, local community members, teachers, university students, researchers, and avid birdwatchers.

Naim Khandakar extended a warm welcome to all guests and participants, offering a concise introduction to the World Migratory Bird Day (WMBD) celebration. The event was officially inaugurated with a brief welcome from the Headmaster of Lombordia Government Primary School, Md. Obaidur Rhaman. In his words, the headmaster expressed gratitude to the students and teachers for their active involvement and applauded Jagannath University for orchestrating the WMBD celebration with the

backing of the EAAFP. Wrapping up this session, participants were treated to a documentary titled "Migratory Birds of Bangladesh."

Following that, participants received foundational information regarding the population of migratory birds in the Ganges-Brahmaputra-Meghna delta in Bangladesh. The aim was to enhance awareness among school-going students, teachers, and local residents regarding migratory waterbirds. Emphasis was placed on the crucial significance of conserving migratory waterbirds and their habitats in the Ganges-Brahmaputra-Meghna delta.

Following the informative session, a bird-watching activity took place, attracting the participation of school students and local youth eager to observe migratory birds. Students were actively engaged in learning how to identify various migratory bird species during this practical lesson. The participants displayed great enthusiasm while using binoculars for the bird-watching activity, further enhancing their connection with and understanding of these magnificent creatures.

Continuing from the preceding session, informational flyers highlighting details about migratory birds, their flyways, and the significance of conserving both the birds and their habitats were distributed to participants. This distribution aimed to enhance the participants knowledge of migratory birds and promote their conservation. Additionally, EAAFP-produced print posters centered around the theme of WMBD 2023 were distributed. Following this, students engaged in an art competition, channeling their creativity to depict migrating birds and their habitats, fostering a deeper connection to the theme and encouraging artistic expression.

The concluding session brought forth the celebration of creativity as the winners of the Art Competition were acknowledged and rewarded. Naim Khandakar then provided a summary of the day's outcomes, reflecting on the collective efforts and achievements. To formally conclude the World Migratory Bird Day, the Headmaster of Lombordia Government Primary School delivered closing remarks, perhaps expressing gratitude, encouragement, or a glimpse into the impact of the day's events on the participants.
