1.7 Outcome

The results obtained from the implementation of World Migratory Bird Day in Sekolah Dasar Negeri (SDN) Ajee Rayeuk, Aceh Besar, Indonesia:

1. There were 50 students and 30 teachers who were educated about migratory birds
2. There are 20 animal breeders, fishermen and farmers who are also educated about migratory birds
3. 10 village officials from Pasie Lubuk Village expressed their shared commitment to protecting the environment and wildlife.
4. 10 farmers in Pasie Lubuk Village no longer use nets, electric fish shocks and air guns.

1.8 Any additional comment

Our students at Ajee Rayeuk State Elementary School, Aceh Besar are very enthusiastic about welcoming the first World Migratory Bird Day activities held at our school. Our hope as teachers is that we will have another opportunity to celebrate together with students in the next EAAFP program, and we also hope that the costs allocated for WMBD activities can be increased again next year, so that we can share more of the allocated costs for shopping for souvenirs and bird posters among students-teachers-community, remembering that carrying out festival activities in the form of providing souvenirs and posters of birds became a lasting memory for young children to be part of protecting migratory birds in the future.

Section 2. EVENT PROGRAMME

The implementation of World Migratory Bird Day 2023 activities aims to increase awareness about the importance of bird migration in the ecosystem, educate the public about bird migration journeys, support the conservation of birds and their habitats, promote international cooperation, and encourage individual action in protecting birds and the environment. The October edition of WMBD activities was carried out at Ajee Rayeuk State Elementary School (SDN) and in Gampong Pasie Lubuk.

The first activity was carried out at the Ajee Rayeuk State Elementary School (SDN) with students and teachers. The activity began with group exercise and observing the environment around the school. School students are provided with bird stickers, stationery and WMBD flyers which have been prepared by teachers at the school. The main hope of this activity is to provide education to students about migratory birds. This can help students understand more about nature and the importance of preserving the natural environment. They can learn about bird species, and the threats faced by migratory birds. This activity can also increase environmental awareness among

students. They can understand that migratory birds are an important part of the ecosystem and that preserving their natural habitat is very important. This can inspire them to care more about the environment and take small steps to protect nature.

By distributing bird stickers, students can learn about various types of birds in Aceh. This can help them appreciate Indonesia's biodiversity and understand that each type has a unique role in the ecosystem. Distributing stickers can be a fun and creative activity for students. They can decorate their notebooks or personal belongings with bird stickers, which can increase their fun and enthusiasm for learning. This activity can also involve students' families. The implementation of World Migratory Bird Day in October 2023 was carried out at the Ajee Rayeuk State Elementary School (SDN) with students and teachers. The second

location was carried out in Gampong (village) Pasie Lubuk, Want Jaya District, Aceh Besar Regency, Aceh Province, Indonesia. This activity was carried out under the responsibility of SDN Ajee Rayeuk with the teacher implementing it. The activity was attended by 50 students, 30 teachers, 20 animal breeders, fishermen, farmers, 10 village officials from Pasie Lubuk Village and 10 farmers. All participants \pm 120 people.
